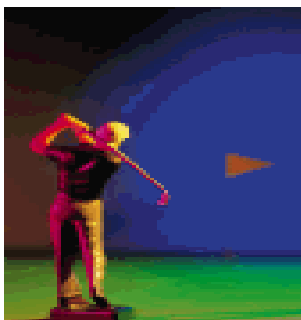


Desert Willow Golf Resort Resident Card/Rules

1. Resident Cards may only be used by the registered card holder.
2. Resident Card holders may book tee times up to 72 hours in advance of desired time.
3. Resident Card holders reserving a tee time more than 72 hours in advance, or playing as part of a group in a tee time made more than 72 hours in advance, will be charged the full rate.
4. Guests of Resident Card holders do not receive the resident discount rate - all guests will be charged the full rate.
5. Resident Cards must be shown at the time of check-in. Residents who do not present their Resident Card will be charged the full rate.
6. Resident Card holders are required to guarantee tee times with a credit card. No-shows are billed in-full. Cancellations are accepted, but must be received by the golf shop 24 hours prior to the scheduled tee time.
7. Resident Cards are issued on an annual basis and expire at the end of the month in which applied.

Guidelines And Rules Governing Use

What is The Palm Desert Resident Golf Card?

The golf card provides Palm Desert residents discounted golf rates at the City's Desert Willow Golf Resort. Golfers with a resident card pay \$45.00 per round of golf during the season and \$35.00 per round of golf during the off-season.

Where Can I Get My Palm Desert Resident Golf Card?

The Coachella Valley Recreation and Park District (CVR&PD) is responsible for establishing residency and issuing cards. Stop by the Palm Desert Community Center, 43-900 San Pablo Ave., Palm Desert, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and noon through 4:00 p.m. Saturday.

What is Residency?

Residency is determined by a person's primary residence according to the California Vehicle Code, Section 12505. Resident golf cards will only be issued to residents who qualify by providing proof of this status.

Residency is not automatically established by ownership of property in Palm Desert nor is it based on ownership of or employment with a Palm Desert business. The State of California defines Palm Desert as a no-low property tax city; property tax dollars do not go to operating the Desert Willow Golf Resort.

How Do I Prove Residency?

A person must have a valid California Driver's License (CDL) with a Palm Desert address (physical), must live within Palm Desert City Limits, and a current utility bill (non-commercial properties). The utility bill must have the resident's name and Palm Desert service address listed. Those applicants who do not have a valid CDL with a Palm Desert address may prove residency by obtaining an official California Identification Card (CID) issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) with a Palm Desert physical address and a current utility bill, both the identification and utility bill must have the same name and address listed. **No exception to the above proof of residency will be accepted.**

Proof required by the DMV to obtain a California Identification Card may vary depending on the circumstances. However, the basic information required is **a birth certificate (certified copy)/ legal presence document (passport) and your social security card.** If you are not required to obtain a social security number, then a letter of denial from the SS Office must be provided.

How Much Will it Cost?

There is a minimal processing fee of \$8.00 per card. Each year you will need to renew your card by reestablishing residency. The renewal fee is \$8.00, and the cost for replacement of a lost or stolen card is \$15.00.

If you do not present your old card at the time of renewal, it will be considered lost or stolen, and you will be charged the \$15.00 replacement cost. Please make sure that you keep your card and bring it with you upon renewing.

When Do Cards Expire and When and How Will I Need to Renew My Card?

All cards expire at the end of the month in which issued (i.e. a card issued on January 3, 2001 will expire January 31, 2002).

Residents can begin renewing cards in the month prior to the month of expiration. Proof of residency will be required each year. The same requirements outlined in "How Do I Prove Residency?" will be required.

Can Other Individuals in The Home Obtain A Resident Golf Card?

Spouse/Dependents

A spouse must show a California Driver's License or California Identification Card with a Palm Desert physical address. The utility bill of his/her spouse is acceptable, but it must reflect the same last name. If the last names are different, a marriage certificate is necessary for proof of residency for the unnamed spouse. If both last names are listed on the utility bill, then both may obtain a Resident Golf Card.

Children and dependents can obtain a Resident Golf Card up to and including the age of 23. Proof of residency for children and dependents must be provided by one of the following:

1. Student ID from a neighboring school/college and proof of residency of the guardian as stated above;
2. A CDL with a Palm Desert address and a parent's utility bill showing the same last name; or
3. Legal documentation that the son/daughter is the resident's dependent and proof of residency as listed.

Friend or Significant Other:

Each person must have a California Driver's License or a California Identification Card with a Palm Desert address and one utility bill reflecting service to the Palm Desert address. If the individual does not pay the utility bills, a bank statement or other official mail (most recent) must be

What if Your Business Owns a Residential Unit?

The same proof of residency is required: A California Driver's License or California Identification Card plus a utility bill reflecting the same name as the individual(s) and a Palm Desert physical address.

What Are The Fees for Non-Resident Card Holders?

Non-resident card holders will pay the established green fee rate. Rates will vary from season to season. The green fees are subject to change without notice.
